Why we care

Many discarded materials are recyclable somewhere, but they are not picked up at your curb. Learn where you can take them.

Simple, positive steps

Save the items below to transport to a site that will accept them. The information can change quickly so it's best to call first or check with Metro's Recycling Hotline at 503 234-3000

- Rigid block foam and other #6 plastics
 - Agilyx Corp. in Tigard
- Packaging peanuts & bubble wrap
 - Your local mailing service store
- Plastic bags
 - o Fred Meyer, New Seasons, Albertsons, Safeway, and QFC stores
- Rigid plastic containers (boxes, clamshells, lids) # 2, 4, or 5
 - Save for an event, such as <u>James Recycling</u> (August 29) or <u>Planetcon</u> in Hillsboro (January 2021)
- Fluorescent bulbs (They are hazardous waste; do not put in garbage.)
 - o Lowe's or Batteries Plus stores
 - o Metro's transfer stations in NW Portland and Oregon City
 - Home Depot (compact fluorescent bulbs only)
- Household batteries
 - Batteries Plus stores, Division Hardware & Paint, Metro Hazardous Waste (may be a fee)
 - o Rechargeables: All the above plus Lowe's and Free Geek
- Electronic equipment
 - See Find a Recycler.
- Books that are no longer useful
 - o Goodwill sites
- Cloth products that are no longer useful
 - Goodwill sites
- Athletic shoes
 - Nike and Foot Traffic stores
- Clean construction wood
 - See Find a Recycler.
- Bike inner tubes at Community Cycling Center in NE Portland
- Clean mattresses at PJ's Sleep Shop in SE Portland
